### Moore's Chapel 2009

The church is not an organization, but an organism, that is vitally connected as one body and which receives its nourishment, guidance and direction from the Head, Jesus Christ. The Church is not simply a building, not an administrative committee, but the gathering of the people of God and one body of Christ. The church is a living organism, rather than a structured organization. Like any living organism, the church must do one of two things: grow or die.

God has blessed Moore's Chapel in many ways and Moore's Chapel, as a living being, is a growing congregation. Not only have we matured in inspirational worship services, mission and ministry, and family style fellowship, we have also increased in membership, attendance, and budget. We continually

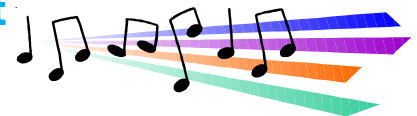
work together as a team; we meet together, worship together, serve together, sing together, share our heavy burdens of life together, and of course, eat together. Moore's Chapel is the living, moving, growing, and transforming body of Christ.

While, in 2008, we celebrated the successful completion of our new "Underwood Educational Building," this year, we set up new rules and regulations for it; we started our "Second Pledge" drive in the beginning of March, and led many fundraising events. For the last three years, we successfully finished our "First Pledge"; A total of 69 family units pledged \$396,000 and we over received \$400,000. We started our "Second Pledge" drive in the beginning of March. A total of 46 family units faithfully pledged \$250,000 for the second capital campaign and are doing well in receiving pledged money (over \$100,000 received so far). We have been paying "interest only" and we will start "principal and interest" payments in April 2010. Even through financial difficulty, we decided that we would increase our budget to over \$200,000 for 2010. It is hard to imagine that we were a small congregation with a budget of \$17,000 in 1982.

God has allowed us to have a variety of missions and ministries, and many opportunities to serve people near and far. Just like every year, 2009 at Moore's Chapel was very full and well rounded as we sought to serve God and to love Jesus Christ in many ways: through worship, mission, Christian education for all ages, Bible studies, and a variety of Fellowship events. If I had to pick an activity that really marked our growth in mission and ministry of 2009, it would be "The Bible in 90 Days."

"The Bible in 90 Days" is essentially a Bible reading program in which we read through the entire Bible, book by book, for 90 days. Throughout the DVD lectures in one of four weekly small group meetings (Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday), we learned the background, history and authorship of each book, its time frame and major themes, and discussed the crucial lessons God wants us to learn. We also shared how this week's Bible readings affected our daily lives.

Additionally, my Sunday sermon during this period of time came from the reading assignment of each week. This format gave us consistency and integrity. More than 50 people participated and most of them finished their difficult and lengthy reading assignment each day. We successfully completed this spiritual formation program from Jan. 11 to April 12, and the feedback and participation was more than we could have imagined.

Life and death are a part of the circle of life, and even though we have lost friends like John Wood, we have also gained new lives, like Ethan James Elliott and Owen James Yates. God has added more new faces and families this year and promises that we will continue to grow with the additions of new families in the future. Moore's Chapel received 11 new members through the Baptism and Confirmation Class. Scott and Eileen Butler, Jane Wood, Mary Ibrahim, Larry Dixon, Mark Walters, Andy and Jodi Wahlund, Lana Hammel, and Fred and Stacy Cost.

This year we had four high school graduates. Alison DiFilippo, Calvin Mlynarik, GaHye Koo, and Adam Huller. They are soon-to-be teachers, artists, musicians, engineers, soldiers, diplomats, businessmen, and much more, who will grow and share God's love and grace with the world. We were able to celebrate two baptisms, McKenna Elliott and Scott Butler; three weddings, Megan and Dave Wiecek, Ross and Lana Johnson, and Larry and Lisa

Dixon. We are glad that we could witness these special events as a church family.

Since Moore's Chapel currently has four active military personnel (Matthew Harvey, Fred Cost, Kelly Hannum, and Jason Lehr), and it is a great blessing to have them as part of our church family; it was a privilege to hear their living testimonies in Christ from the pulpit; Fred Cost on Memorial Day and Kelly Hannum on Veteran's Day.

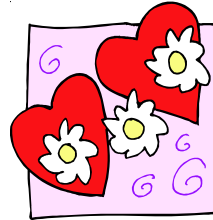

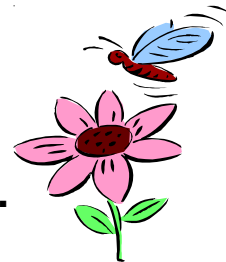

Since March 2007, the church has received \$240 of building funds but I know this can be greatly improved!

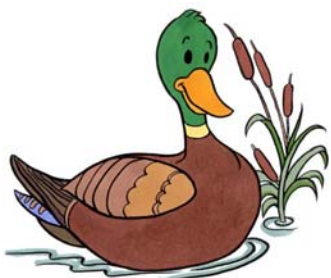

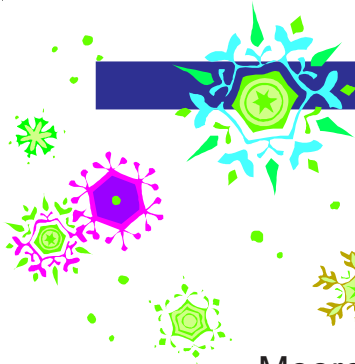


## Christmas Cookie Rules...

1. If you eat a Christmas cookie fresh out of the oven, it has no calories because everyone knows that the first cookie is the test and thus calorie free.
2. If you drink a diet soda after eating your second cookie, it also has no calories because the diet soda cancels out the cookie calories.
3. If a friend comes over while you're making your Christmas cookies and needs to sample, you must sample with your friend.
